Release of TIME System Information

Required Information

TIME System information can only be released to an authorized criminal justice agency. Release of TIME System information requires that an agency have an active ORI and a signed agency agreement with the agency requesting information. If you don't know if an agency has an ORI, please contact CIBTrain@doj.state.wi.us. Sample agency agreements are available on CIB's Wilenet page.

New Protection Order Type Code

Canadian Domestic Violence Protection Order

There is a new protection order type available for entry. Domestic Violence protection orders issued by Canadian courts can be entered into the TIME System. Wisconsin statute 813.1283 orders that Canadian Domestic Violence protection orders be given full faith and credit by the courts in Wisconsin. The authorizes law enforcement agencies to enforce the provisions of the Canadian Domestic Violence protection orders the same as any protection order or injunction issued by a court in Wisconsin or any other court.

If an agency needs to enter a Canadian Domestic Violence protection order, users should use Protection Order Type Code 15 for entry.

Type of Order	
Code	Description
8	Bail Bond Conditions (entry of applicable statute number required)
15	Canadian Domestic Violence Protection Order (s. 813.1283)
4	Child Abuse Injunction (s. 813.122)
3	Child Abuse Temporary Restraining Order (s. 813.122)

TRAIN IS LEAVING THE STATION!

Acadis Transition Project: CIB is in the process of transitioning to a new Learning Management System to replace TRAIN. CIB has chosen to utilize Acadis, along with the Training and Standards Bureau. CIB has been migrating data from TRAIN.

Retired Query: Taser Registration Data

Portal Form 0078

Axon and Nlets have announced that they are planning to retire the Taser service and message key transaction that allows law enforcement to query the Axon database for Taser registration data. As a result, Portal Form 0078 and MKE "TSQ" will be retired and removed from the TIME System.

DMV CODES FOR OPEN SEARCH

Are you an Open Search user? Open Search has had a change recently where the model codes are no longer being displayed as “Explorer” or “Highlander” but are now being returned as a numeric code. DOT explains that this is to align more closely with federal model codes.

Since Open Search returns vehicle information from DOT, they have provided a spreadsheet that translates the numeric codes into the name of the vehicle model, including different model options. The spreadsheet is current and provides the codes for vehicle make/model combinations up to model year 2022.

The spreadsheet is available on the secure side of Wilenet. After login, click “Resources”, “DOT – DMV Resources”, and “WI DOT Vehicle Model Codes.”

NEW AUDIT FEATURE FOR CJIS AUDIT

Is your agency being audited? CIB uses the CJIS Audit program to audit criminal justice agencies in Wisconsin. A new feature now allows you to submit your audit documentation back to your auditor right in the online software!

Once you complete your audit questionnaire, the last question on each questionnaire will allow users to upload any documents to the questionnaire including agreements, rosters, CHRI queries, network diagrams, etc.

This feature is now available and will affect agencies that have not started their audit yet.

NEW WISCONSIN LICENSE PLATES – AVAILABLE NOW!

Two new license plates have been issued by the Wisconsin Department of Transportation. They include Elkhart Lake’s Road America and Versiti, a non-profit organization. To query the Elkhart Lake’s Road America plate or Versiti plate, use plate type code “CV” or leave blank. To enter the Elkhart Lake’s Road America plate or Versiti plate, use plate type code “OR”.
