



APPLICATION FOR AN EXTENSION OF THE TIME LIMIT TO COMPLETE PREPARATORY TRAINING

Time frames for completion of preparatory training are set forth in Wisconsin Statute § 165.85(4)(a)3., (4)(b)3., and (4)(c)3. All law enforcement, tribal law enforcement, jail, and secure juvenile detention officers have within their probationary period of employment, not to exceed 12 months from their first date of employment, to complete preparatory training. **Upon a showing of good cause by a recruit or the recruit's employer, the LEB may extend the recruit's original probationary period of employment for a period of time the LEB deems appropriate.**

Applications for an extension must be approved by the Law Enforcement Standards Board (LEB). The LEB meets on the first Tuesday in March, June, and December, and the first Wednesday in September. Applicants will be notified of the LEB's decision within 15 days following the LEB meeting in which their request is considered.
